The tests are carried out altogether at the same times, although some children may be given extra time, rest breaks, a reader/prompter or a scribe depending on their academic/emotional needs. There will be a Y6 breakfast club that week to get them fully prepared (more details to follow). We are very mindful of not putting extra pressure on the children but encourage them to focus fully and to do their best. We continue to push for high attendance, especially at this time so the pupils are fully prepared. If you have any issues with getting your child into school, please phone the school office or speak to Mrs Hardy/ Mrs Grace for support. For Y2 SATS are no longer statutory, therefore we will not be administering these in May as in previous years. We plan to use the materials as we see fit as part of our teacher assessments in mid/late June for some pupils and will just call them independent booklets and do our best to make things as normal as possible for the children. PSHE/RSE We have been developing and renewing our Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE) Policy and schemes of work. Schools have the right and obligation to teach RSHE topics to prepare children for life when they leave school. These lessons will be taught during the summer term in Y2, Y4 and Y6. The vast majority of the content is compulsory, there is one lesson in Y6 where pupils may be withdrawn. The curriculum information is on our website but a letter will be coming out soon with further details.
